CAPE ANNE CITIZENS' ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEETING April 20, 2024 Minutes

President Ryan Hostetter called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m. Attendance was noted on a sign-in sheet circulated during the meeting.

No new members were present.

<u>Meeting Minutes</u>- Minutes for the December meeting, as published in the Tide, were accepted by acclamation.

<u>*Treasurer's Report*</u> – The FY 2024 Second Quarter report, as published in the Tide, was accepted by acclamation.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- <u>*Treasurer's Report*</u> We have received two county payments so far this fiscal year. The Fidelity bond has been renewed. The marina loan was paid off in March. The savings account will be converted to a short-term CD to take advantage of higher interest earnings.
- <u>Maintenance</u> We have a problem with erosion on the North Shore shoreline, with the bulkhead failing. The county provided a temporary fix by filling a hole behind the bulkhead with rocks. We need a long-term solution and are talking with the county about what can be done. It could cost \$300,000 to repair the bulkhead. We need to determine if this is a county or community responsibility. For the swim pier, we need to develop a scope of work for repairs to get a quote from a contractor. Redecking does not require a permit but changing the pilings does. We can probably repair the pier at the entrance and redeck the swim pier as community projects, saving a lot of money. We will get estimates for the projects. Replacing the pavilion roof is on the project list, also.
- <u>*Harbor Master*</u> Slips are available at the marina.
- <u>Special Events</u> Smaller events requiring minimal planning would be nice, such as happy hours at the beach or on the loops. Volunteers to coordinate are welcome.
- <u>Community Outreach</u> We are looking for volunteers to help compile a welcome package for residents.
- <u>*Plants Committee*</u> We will clean up the Broadwater Parkway shoreline this afternoon, removing invasive plants to prepare the area for replanting with native plants this fall.

NEW BUSINESS

- <u>*Elections*</u> The slate as listed in the Tide was accepted.
- <u>Community Participation</u> We would like to interest more residents in community meetings and activities. All residents contribute to the community budget through the tax assessment. We could survey residents to get input on what activities would be welcome.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:27.

Facilities and Maintenance

The new mowing contractor seems to be doing a good job this summer. Please let Darcy know if you have any questions or concerns. The county permit office has told us that we need a scope of work and an estimate in order obtain a permit for the pier work. The job is very small compared to most pier construction and we are having trouble finding someone willing to talk with us about the work. The large hickory tree that blew over in the storm a few weeks ago, on Broadwater parkway, has been removed.

Harbor Master

Tides have been better this year than last. Five slips are rented and are being used. Please contact Harbor Master Mike Waldow (443-744-9314) if you are interested in a slip or a key for the boat ramp. Piling cone caps have been installed to deter birds on the pier and seem to be working. Some touch up to the decking stain will be done this summer.

Plants Committee

The plants along the Cherry Blossom shoreline look good, even through the recent heat and drought. We took away six truckloads of plant debris from the Broadwater shoreline during the spring cleanup. Many thanks to all who took part in that effort. A willow oak tree was planted on Great Oak Parkway, and two black gum trees (no gum balls from these trees) were planted by the bench at the pocket beach. We are submitting an application for a Unity Garden grant to purchase plants for the Broadwater shoreline and for trees in the Broadwater parkway. We are also planning to plant additional trees on community property to maintain and expand our tree canopy.

Special Events

We need volunteers to plan the Crab Fest, with the goal to simplify the event so that planning is not so burdensome on those organizing it. Suggestions and volunteers for other events are welcome also.
